Where they nest... safe warm sites in cracks or holes in old trees...

Brilliant because... they are acrobatic and stay in the UK, not venturing far from where they hatched.



Where they nest... big solitary nests, usually high up in tall trees.

Brilliant because... they are extremely intelligent and can even use basic tools.



Where they nest... hidden near or on the ground in hollows and crannies under hedgerows.

Brilliant because... they are bright, cheerful and one of few species that sing throughout winter.

MAGPIE

Where they nest... large domed nests in tall trees or thorned bushes.

Brilliant because... once they find a mate, they often stay together for the rest of their lives.

STARLING

Where they nest... in cavities in trees

and holes in outbuildings (or even houses).

Brilliant because... they gather in numbers and swoop and dive in the sky in murmurations.



Where they nest... close together in hedgerows, sometimes nooks bushes and in buildings.

Brilliant because... they can reach 50km per hour, are intelligent and have one of the largest brains.

Don't ever touch eggs or disturb a nest,

as birds are easily spooked and may abandon it!
